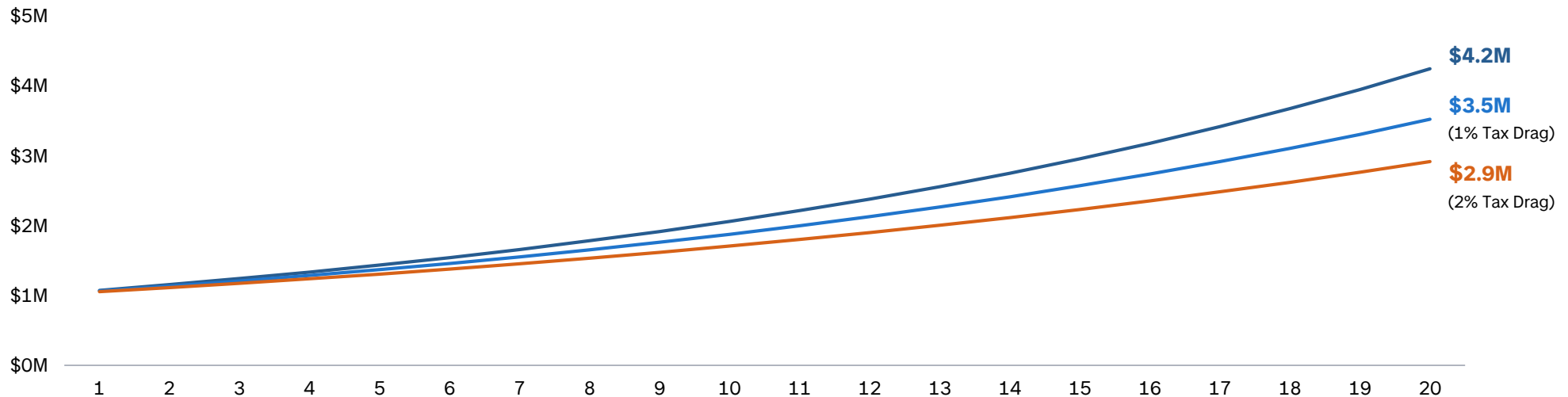

HYPOTHETICAL GROWTH OF \$1MM OVER 20 YEARS¹



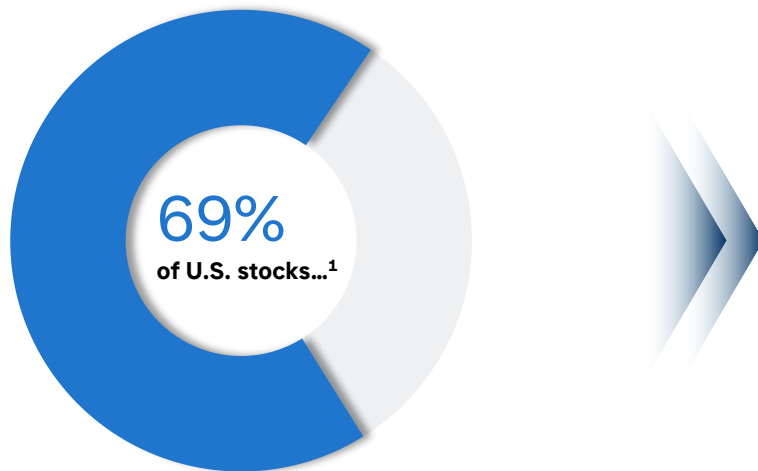

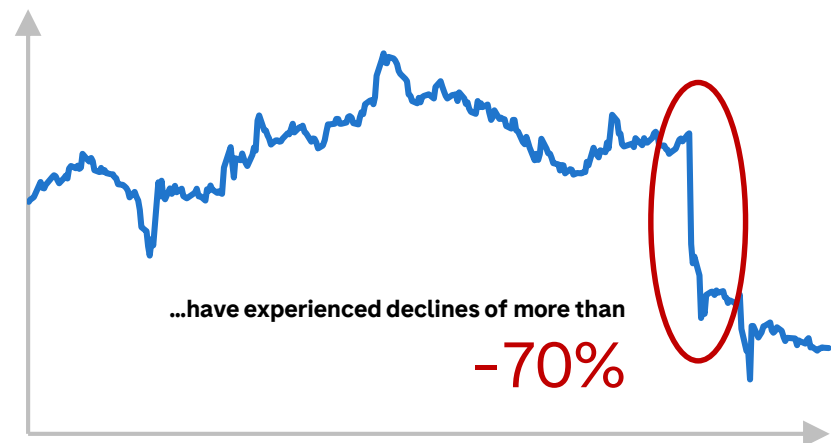
Avoiding Taxable Gains Can Lead to Unintended Risk

The taxable impact of selling large unrealized gains often results in unintended concentrations, exposing the portfolio to additional risk

Most stocks experience significant declines at some point in time, even if temporary



A concentration in one of these positions at the wrong time could have an outsized impact on your portfolio



- Client wealth depends heavily on the movements of a single stock
- Exposed to greater volatility and higher risk than a diversified portfolio
- Large price drawdowns occur frequently for individual stocks; many stocks never recover to previous highs
- Most stocks underperform the broad market over the long term; exposure to tomorrow's winners is critical to keeping up

The Value of Tax-efficient Investing

There are many strategies that can help capitalize on tax-efficiency to improve long-term wealth

- Taxes may be **more easily reduced** than other drags on return through tax-efficient investment strategies.
- Unlike investment-related risks, variables that guide active tax management (e.g., tax rates, brackets, filing status) are **known but not static**.
- There are a **variety of tax management strategies**, each offering a unique set characteristics to allow for a highly tailored solution to any financial situation.
- While increasing after-tax returns is an important benefit, there are **other strategic benefits to consider**, such as: smoothing portfolio transitions, generating income, and diversifying concentrated positions.

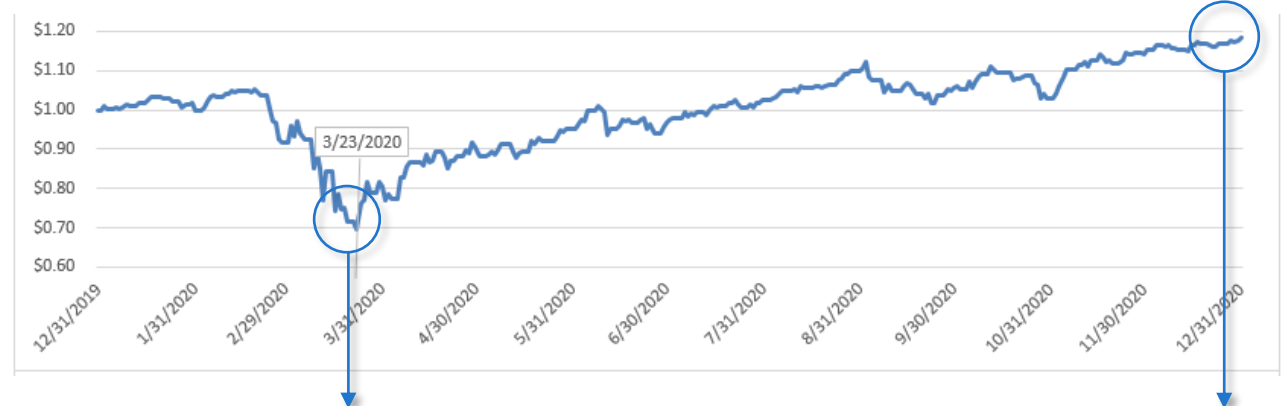

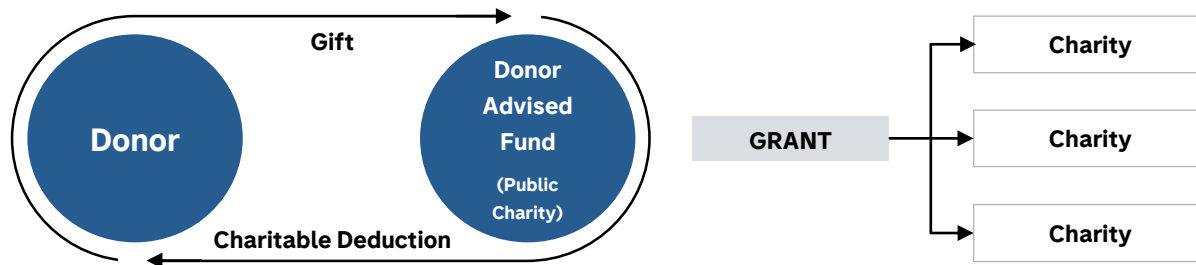

Donor Advised Funds

Pursue your philanthropic objectives while potentially receiving an instant tax benefit that can help offset capital gains

WHAT IS A DONOR ADVISED FUND?



- **Donors retain advisory privileges** over how money should be granted to charities.⁽²⁾
- Given that DAFs are structured as public charities, **donors may receive a charitable contribution tax deduction** when a contribution is made, allowing them time to develop a plan for grants afterwards.⁽³⁾
- Contributions to a DAF are **invested in line with donor preferences** and have the potential to grow tax-free while the donor recommends which charities to support.



Morgan Stanley Global Impact Funding Trust (MS GIFT)

- Investment platform professionally managed by Morgan Stanley.
- Total grants to charities of over \$5 billion since inception.
- Can take complex assets, including Crypto, Real Estate, and Art.
- \$25K initial minimum contribution; \$5K follow-on contribution
- When combined with Tax Management Services, contributions to MS Gift can help offset additional realized gains to accelerate a tax-efficient transition to a diversified target portfolio.

1. The maximum deduction for a gift to a donor advised fund, as a public charity, is limited to a certain percentage of adjusted gross income (AGI), depending upon the type of asset gifted; deductions exceeding AGI limits may be carried forward for up to five years.

2. Grants can be directed to US organizations that are tax-exempt public charities, US religious houses of worship, and US-qualified foreign charitable organizations. At an additional cost, other domestic and foreign organizations that do not qualify as US public charities can be considered. MS GIFT retains final authority of how money is invested and which charities receive donations.

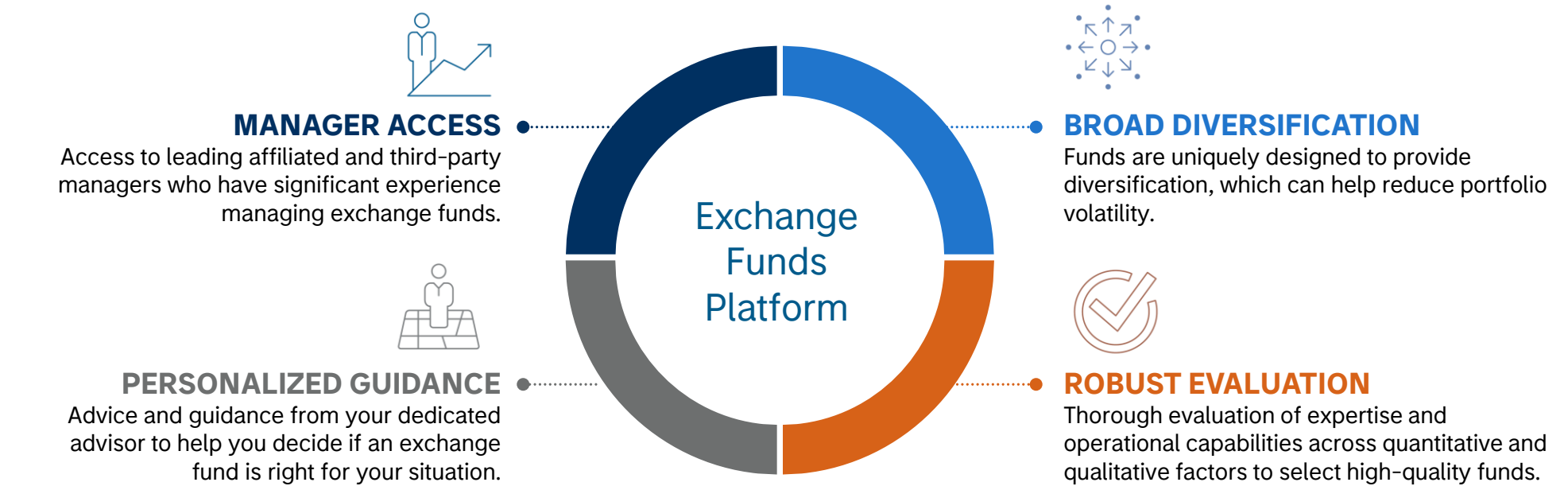
